Floyd Collins Lincoln, was born September 6, 1924 to Ruth (Long) and Miles Lincoln in Scopus, MO and passed away at the Missouri Veterans Home on September 11, 2012. He had 17 brothers and sisters who helped out on the farm. He is survived by his brother Ken Lincoln of Millersville, and sister Lorene Walter of Jackson.

Floyd was drafted into the Army in February 1943 at the age of 18 and was honorably discharged in May of 1946. He fought in World War II & was stationed in Germany, Belgium and France. He was a machine gunner and received the ETO ribbon, three Bronze Stars, American Theatre Ribbon and the Victory Medal.

He married Martha Opaline Milligan on December 28, 1950 in Leachville, Arkansas. They had four children Pamela Arnold of Chaffee; Timothy (Carol) Lincoln of Marble Hill; Andrea (Mike) Wendel of Jackson; and Sheri Belinda who died during infancy. They have five grandchildren; seven great-grandchildren and one great-great-grandchild.

He loved to hunt, fish and work in the garden. Floyd was a 3rd generation carpenter for over 30 years. He was very proud that his son, Tim, continued the family tradition into the 4th generation.

He was baptized in 1962 and was a member of the Scopus Church of Christ for fourteen years. He joined the West Side Church of Christ in Jackson when it was built in 1976. He was a faithful member for 36 years.
