



Garry Glenn Moore

August 22, 1956 - April 2, 2025

Garry Glenn Moore, 68, Chief of the Whitewater, Missouri Fire Department, died in the line of duty responding to the tornado that struck Delta, MO., on Wednesday, April 2, 2025.

He was born on August 22, 1956, in Cape Girardeau, MO, to Howard and Betty (Acup) Moore.

He and Gracelynn "Grace" Darby were married on January 13, 1979, in Enfield, CT.

Garry graduated from Woodland High School in Marble Hill in 1974 and joined the Navy. He served for 20 years before retiring and moving to Whitewater, Missouri, where he worked at several businesses before finishing his career with Nestle Purina in Bloomfield. He began volunteering as a first responder in the 1970s and volunteered for multiple ambulance and fire fighting departments. His volunteerism led him to the Whitewater Fire Department, where he ascended to Chief in the mid-1990s.

Garry received a bachelor's degree from Southeast Missouri State University.

Survivors include his mother, Betty, and his wife, Grace; two sons, Chris (Jessi) Moore of Cape Girardeau, MO, and Steven (Marla) Moore of Jackson,

MO; and one daughter, Heather (Darryl) Stratman of Glenallen, MO. A brother, Brooks (Julie) Moore of Jackson, MO; and sister, Carrie (Mike) Holland of Cape Girardeau, MO. As well as eight grandchildren: Megan Moore, Ty Stratman, Ryleigh Moore, Everly Moore, Haisley Moore, Lydia Moore, Emily Moore, Adam Moore.

He was preceded in death by his father and one grandson, Nathan Moore.
