We had a lot of fun together and good memories from those years and thereafter. Larry was one of the of motorcycle riders at College High School and I am sharing a photo of some of us including Larry taken in May of 1966 at College High School. He is the third one from the right and I am the fifth from the right in the picture. Larry was quite the Daredevil. One time while we were in high school a group of us had a camp out and we were in our barn. Larry spotted an old rickety and probably half rotten ladder that was attached hanging down from the inside of the barn roof following the contour of the roof up to the peak of the barn.
