Marell Toots Mayfield, 88 years old, of Patton, MO, died Thursday, November 8, 2007 at the Jackson Manor in Jackson, MO.

He was born June 28, 1919 in Glen Allen, MO, son of John Franklin and Ercy Eller Brown Mayfield. He and Algerene Marie Mayfield were married November 22, 1946 and she died June 6, 1996.

Mr. Mayfield was Bollinger County Treasurer for 4 years, postmaster and rural mail carrier for 23 years, worked in the timber business and as a farmer, a Meadow Heights school bus driver for 10 years, and cared for foster children for 35 years. He also was a member of the Little Whitewater Baptist Church

where he served as song director, in the Little Whitewater Quartet and as Sunday School Teacher.

Marell served his country proudly as a Staff Sergeant during WWII where he earned an American Defense Service Medal, a Good Conduct Ribbon and an American Theater Ribbon.

Survivors include; two sons, Donnie W. (Sarah) Mayfield and Richard L. (Kathy) Mayfield both of Jackson, two daughters, Susie (Tom) Smith of Patton, Karen (Robert) Craft of New Wells, MO, one brother, Don Mayfield of Florissant, MO, one sister, Nelda (Franklin) Wilkinson of Cape Girardeau, twelve grandchildren and twelve great-grandchildren.

Preceding him in death were his parents, one daughter Donna Mayfield, one brother, Eston Mayfield, and one sister Alene Cook.
